# How to read your Academic Report (Year 11)



- 1. The Autumn Mock Grade is the GCSE/BTEC grade that they earned in the first mock assessment period in November. This is a useful comparison to see what they achieved in the first mock compared to this one.
- 2. The Spring Mock Grade is the GCSE/BTEC grade that they earned in their second, more recent, mock assessment period. These are the overall grades achieved in the recent exams. Where coursework is assessed (Music, Drama, the Arts, BTEC subjects), this has been accounted for in the mock grade given.
- **3. The Predicted Grade** is what, if they continue working as they currently are, their teacher expects them to be awarded at the end of each of their courses.
- **4. The Target Grade** is the minimum grade we expect your child to achieve given their previous attainment (i.e. Key Stage 2 and 3 assessments). Please note, these are generated using national data and are not teacher assessed.
