Course Overview

A-Level RPE explores **Philosophy of Religion, Ethics and Christianity** as an academic subject built on analysing arguments rather than just memorising beliefs. You'll investigate big questions about God, reality, morality, and the role of religion in the modern world, drawing on influential thinkers and contrasting ideas. The course develops skills in logical reasoning, evaluation, discussion, and extended writing, with most assessment through essays. It provides strong preparation for degrees such as **theology, philosophy, law, politics, history, sociology, and psychology**, and can lead to careers in **education, journalism, public policy, social work, law, and roles in community and charity sectors**, as well as any profession that values critical thinking and communication.

Course Requirements

5 GCSEs graded 5 or above, including Maths at grade 5 and English at grade 6.
Grade 7 in Religious Studies required.

Assessment

You will be assessed by two 3-hour written exams at the end of year 13 (one for component 1, and one for component 2).

Each paper is worth 100 marks and constitutes 50% of the overall A-level.

The full details of all units studied will be given to all students – as will the 'weighting' accorded to each unit. Reading lists and past paper questions will also provide crucial support for students.
